A GENEROUS, UNEXPECTED GIFT

We had a very pleasant and generous surprise in our mail last week – a check for \$10,000 along with a wonderful note from Carolyn Apland Reeder, which needs to be shared!

"Greetings to you all in the wonderful name of Christ Jesus.

Not many will remember me there. We were the Apland family who lived just across the field from the parsonage at that time. The field was turned into the new church – new to me as I remember the older, smaller white church. I would wander through out the neighborhood when I was occasionally in that direction and keep an eye on the growth of the area.

Our residence in the community was during the time of Pastor Sorenson (who went to a large church in Everett), Pastor Ringo (whom I found one year at a Lenten Service at a Lutheran church in the University District of Seattle) and Pastor and Mrs. Fold Brendt who served many years (who subsequently went to a Seattle church as a visitation pastor) Pastor Brandt confirmed both myself and my younger sister and Mrs. Brandt was superintendent of the Sunday School for many years.

During our time there myself, my sister, and any brothers (3) still at home, taught Sunday School, sang in choirs, took care of the younger children who gathered in the Parsonage each week when our time came up and attended the Luther League. I was married in the new church (although it didn't last long) as was my sister (whose marriage remains strong and is here in Yuma). My father was treasurer of the water district and people form the community would come to our home each month to pay their bills and chat a little.

I enjoyed my time while there and credit the instruction I received there in part with whatever good may have come from my life since then, along with my parents' instructions.

As mentioned, I am in Yuma now, near my sister so she can be closer and who takes careful watch over me although I am in my own house here after about a year of hospitalization and rehab for a brain bleed and subsequent falls. The thought is that I will improve and I hope I can proved her right in her good assessment.

My parents have since passed on but all of us children remain alive and my older brother and his wife were even just here in Yuma from Colorado to help me get set up in the new house.

Enclosed is a check for \$10,000. I have recently sold my home in Seattle and it is a part of the tithe. It is a small amount for the church's care of us rambunctious young children that I hope will be accepted and useful.

Please warmly great any who might still remember us."

CALL COMMITTEE UPDATE – Rick Homme

The Transition Committee, after a year's worth of work, phased out early this year and was replaced by the Call Committee. The first order of business for the Committee was to complete a Ministerial Site Profile (MSP). This is essentially an overview of not only Good Shepherd but the greater Snohomish community. It contains information about what GSLC is looking for in a pastor and a great deal about who we are. It essentially is our resume' as a church. When the MSP was finished the Committee began preparing for the actual recruiting/selection process. It developed questions for potential candidates for Zoom interviews and in-person interviews. The committee was provided with actual clergy who agreed to participate in mock interviews both on Zoom and in-person. These mock interviews helped the Committee sharpen and fine-tune it's interview processes.

On May 2nd, the Committee was provided by the Synod with an initial slate of three candidates. All of the candidates were out of the area (Hawaii, Illinois, Texas) and were interviewed by the Committee via Zoom. One of the candidates was only interested in part-time. The second one we felt would not be a fit for our Church. The third candidate was of interest and an invitation was extended to him to come to Snohomish for further interviews. He requested another Zoom interview so he could ask some more questions. We accommodated that request. A few days later he let us know that he felt the timing was not right to re-locate his family.

This left us with no viable candidates. We have subsequently modified our MSP to what we feel better reflects who we are and what we are seeking and re-submitted it to the Synod.

Pastor Eric Samuelson, our advisor from the Synod for the call process, has told us that the new profile has been posted to the appropriate ELCA website and that we can expect a new slate of candidates by mid to late July.

Outdoor Work Parties:

PLEASE READ...Our Next Church Work Party is scheduled for Monday July 17th starting at 4:30pm. This schedule change is due to me being out of town on July 10th

Projects in the works:

- Currently in progress We are currently evaluating replacing the wall heater in the large downstairs area under the sanctuary. We have received one estimate at this point and will be inquiring with another trusted resource for an additional estimate. All the other furnace and heating equipment is functioning normally and has been serviced for regular maintenance. This was completed by Pilchuck Heating.
- Currently in progress At this point we have a quote from 3 separate fence companies to replace the fences located along both the east and west boundary lines. Our neighbors to the east have agreed to join us in paying to replace that fence. We will be making a decision the first week of July to move forward with one of the bids.
- The east parking lot had a small opening (pothole) near both the disability access parking spots. The hole was recently filled in and patched by Doug and Donna Garland. Thanks to both of you for addressing this, it was very much appreciated!
- Currently in progress In the fellowship hall, both Lori Fox and Pat Veale have been very busy in providing a new "coffee station". This will provide a more aesthetically pleasing area, with more storage, more counter space, and all around easier access for providing coffee at Sunday services and other hosted events. Thanks Lori and Pat!
- Thanks to several devoted individuals for continuing to upkeep the grounds, whether it be the gardening, weeding, or the mowing. THANK YOU!!
