Dear friends, peace and joy be with you.

Greeting, affirmation, reminder/reflection, encouragement, invitation:.

Can you believe January is already over?! It feels like the month has flown by and we are already headlong into the New Year.

This past month I had the opportunity to meet and connect with more of you over lunch, a cup of coffee, or an office visit. It has been a joy to get to know you and spend time with you. In addition, I have really enjoyed the opportunity to see, hear, and learn where God has gifted you, how God has/is using you, and what you feel God has called you to (do).

As we continue to discern God's voice and respond to God's call, I have two encouragements. The first is a reminder that God is the maker of Heaven and earth. The second is to wait. If we look at Psalm 146, verse 6 proclaims, "God is the maker of Heaven and earth." How I think this speaks to, reminds, and encourages us is in two ways: 1) *keep things in perspective*, and 2) *let God do God so you can do you*.

What does it mean that God is the maker of Heaven and earth? First, I think it means God is big. If we think about the Heavens and the earth, we are invited to think about their respective size. Then, we are invited to think about their size compared to one another. If God created the Heavens and the earth, it means God is the Lord of all. This gives us and can renew our perspective. Specifically, I think it can speak to our anxieties, worries, stress, or mess and remind us that God is Lord over whatever we're facing and God is God regardless of what we're going through. And I think this should fill us with hope and encourage us to turn to and put our trust in God because 1) God is a big God and 2) God is Lord over all. So, we need to keep things within a God-perspective.

Second, the distinction between Heaven and earth reminds us of the distinction between God and humanity. God is in Heaven and we are on earth. What that means is we have not only different locations but because of that, different roles. It can be easy to forget that God is God (and that we are human), and in the midst of our stress, duress, or mess, or whatever we might be going through, we can try to overfunction and do things that God is in charge of or responsible for. Psalm 131:1 encourages us by saying, "My heart is not proud and my eyes are not haughty and I do not concern myself with things too great for me, but like a weaned child am I with you." What this means: God is the maker of Heaven and earth so *let God be God so*

that you can be you. It's important to say this: the only responsibility you have right now is to (just) be human. So, let God be God.

Last, the Hebrew Bible has 25 different words for the word "wait". It seems to be an important theme and phenomenon if there are 25 different ways to talk about it. We are in a time of waiting, specifically as we wait, watch, and see what God might do, could do, and wants to do in us, with us, and through us in this next season. If we look at Isaiah 40:30-31, it says, "Those who *wait* on the Lord will renew their strength." *Qavah*, here, means to wait and hope. So, in this next season, I think it is really important that we wait with hope, and "take heart" (as Psalm 27:17) says, and "wait for the Lord" because God is maker of Heaven and earth. God has called us, God has a purpose, and we get to discern God's voice, respond to God's call, and participate in God's plan.

Let's continue to have fun, put prayer first, and ask/seek/knock so that we can discern, see, and respond with more clarity to what God has called us. I look forward to more meet ups, connections, and collaborations.
