Dear friends, peace and joy be with you!

I'm really excited for this coming Sunday (Lent 3), where we'll be working with the Ten Commandments. We're probably all familiar with the Ten Commandments but something we may not have considered is why God gives the Ten Commandments. The Ten Commandments were social and ethical; they were meant to teach God's people how to live in community. Now, more than ever, I think our church, our world, and our society could use a refresher on how to be together and how to live together.

But maybe you're just in a season where you need to receive, and you need to be served—by God and us, sink into this season and drink deeply from grace that God has for you; and when you're ready come join us as we seek to serve and be a part of God's amazing plan!

Let's continue to have fun, enjoy this next and new season, and keep our eyes, ears, heart, and mind open to what God is up to and how God might be inviting us to not just be a part but play a part!
