From the Pastor's Desk

What's up, Church!

Welcome to the month of June! We have a fun summer schedule planned in terms of Christian Education and Formation. Over the summer we're going to undergo two major projects. The first will be preparation for a Fall launch of Spiritual Disciplines. Pastor JP will do reading and research to host seminars, beginning in the Fall, to explore ways we can grow in faith and grow our connection with God – through the Spiritual Disciplines! Second, we will continue our year-long theme of Rooted and for the month of June will explore the ways in which *Curiosity* help Root us in faith and our identity in Christ!

If we look back to last month's theme of *Boredom*, we recall the problem(s) with boredom. One of the primary problems with boredom is our response to bored. We seek to "fill-the-void" with things that don't satisfy. The prophet Jeremiah talks about this when he says, "They dig cisterns that don't hold water" (Jer 2:13). One way to respond to boredom is *Creativity*, the theme of May. Creativity, as we have discussed, is like a hat. It's a new or different way of thinking that helps us address problems, issues, and conundrums of life to lead us to and cultivate the Good Life that God has for us. Creativity, in other words, is the God-given tool to not only get "unstuck" but find and forge the path forward to fullness!

When we become bored, get stuck, and seek to find the way forward, *Creativity* can help us do that. *Curiosity*, and asking the right questions, is another way forward. Voltaire, a French philosopher, considered curiosity to be so important that he valued curiosity, and questions specifically, more than (really good) answers! He says, "I judge a person not by their answers but by their questions." Questions are how we get (life's most important) answers! Even Jesus encourages the disciples to be Curious. In Matthew 7:7-8, Jesus says, "Seek and you will find, knock and the door will be open to you, ask and it will be given to you". But what is it that will lead a person to ask/seek/knock? It's Curiosity! Curiosity is what F.H. Buckley says, will "Jar a person out of lethargy and look…".

The invitation for the month of June is to be Curious, and to allow God to use Curiosity to get you "off-thecouch", so to speak, and get you up, get you moving, and get you motivated to (not just) seek/ask/knock, but find, receive, and have doors opened in your life that will help you live more into the Good Life that God gives and continue to journey forward in your lives of faith!

We have some exciting things happening over the summer, and I am excited to journey with you! As we move towards Pentecost (June 8), celebrate with us by wearing RED or a Hawaiian Shirt! We also have the end-of-the-year BBQ. And if you still have the energy, after our BBQ, we're going to host our very first *Fellowship on Tap* and take the party to a local pub (location will be announced on Pentecost).
