## From the Pastor's Desk

It's going to be a busy month as we prepare for the arrival of the Christ-child (in the midst of a busy holiday goggan). To that and I want to introduce this month's the

holiday season). To that end, I want to introduce this month's theme of peace!
Last month we took a look at various forms and situations of conflict that arise, and we took some time to think about how to confront conflict. We'll flip the script and, in a month we could really use it, we'll focus on peace.
Peace shows up in the Bible in two places: The Hebrew Bible and the Greek New Testament. In the Hebrew Bible, the word, shalom, is used to encompass a broad definition that include:
Wholeness
Completeness
Well-being
Harmony
Prosperity/thriving
Safety
Rest
The idea behind shalom is not the absence of conflict, but the presence of fullness, where every part of our lives are put in right order to include: physical, social, spiritual, emotional, and even economic.
In the Greek New Testament, the word for peace is eirene, which also encompasses a broad definition to include:
Harmony
Conditions for prosperity and well-being
Security
Flourishing
