Dear friends, grace, peace, hope, and joy be with you!

ANDERSON BENEVOLENT FUND – Rick Homme

At the beginning of this year the Committee had \$24,387 available for distribution. This amount included \$5,322 left from the previous year and \$19,067 funded from the Church's investments.

After the Committee made its 4th quarter distributions in early October, there was \$3,616 remaining to either roll forward into 2024 or, if requests came in, to use before the end of this year. Five more requests did come in and awards were made to three of them reducing our remaining balance to \$2,471.

At this time the Committee plans to carry that amount forward into next year to be combined in January with whatever amount is funded to the Committee from the Church's investments

Outdoor Work Parties:

Projects:

- **Completed** Recently Dell Deierling spotted some small water leaks in the stairway. He was able to address these by removing a collection of leaves in the gutters located directly outside. In the next year, we will be addressing some gutter areas that need some repair. Thanks Dell!
- In the works Just two months ago, the west parking lot was upgraded with several new loads of rock. With the continued heavy traffic from the Academy drop-off and pick-up process much of rock has settled, and other areas could use more rock to further stabilize the area. As a result, we will be receiving several more loads of rock in the next month or so. This additional rock will also create more of a uniform parking lot for the west-side of the church.
- In the works In the next several months the lighted cross on the north side of the building will be removed or repaired with an updated version. Dean Kloes has mentioned the use of LED lights for less maintenance and longer life.
