However, we met our actual expenses and managed to build our savings a bit.

LOOKING AHEAD

As we plan for 2023 and the successful calling of a new pastor, our financial needs may be \$17,000 higher (possibly more) than our current budget. The 2023 budget will be approved at our Annual Meeting on January 29. The February newsletter gifts report will reflect the new budget.

Outdoor Work Parties:

Our monthly gardening work parties came to an end in November and will pick back up in Spring 2023. As always, THANKS for all those who volunteered their time and talents throughout the 2022 year, without you maintaining our wonderful building and grounds would be impossible.

Projects in the works:

- Recently the downstairs area directly below the sanctuary (the previous youth room/classroom) was tested for the presence of mold. This was necessary due to the future possible renting of this space by The Academy. There was mold present in the test results conducted by the mold remediation company that we contracted to do the initial tests. At this moment the mold is not active and does not pose any immediate health threat. With that said, the mold that is present will need to be removed and the affected areas cleaned. The next steps will be discussed at the upcoming church council meeting on 1/8/23.
- The fence along the west side of the church grounds has recently suffered several panels to fall over following a couple of the high-wind storms that moved through the area. We will be looking to repair the fallen panels in the very near future.
- There is a small leak along the roof flashing where the sanctuary roof and the fellowship hall roof come together. At this point in the roof, located just above the stairway in the middle hallway, there have been several leaks of dirty water from the roof. This is due to sudden pooling of water that occurred during some

recent weather, including snow melt along with heavy sustained rain. We will be repairing the area as soon as possible.
