Call Committee Update

Things are moving ahead! Having finalized and submitted the Ministry Site Profile (MSP) last month, the Call Committee has been working hard on preparing for the interview stage of the call process. We've been developing questions to ask the candidates, practicing interviewing, and honing our interviewing skills. On May 2nd, Pastor Andy Yee, the Assistant to the Bishop of our Synod, will be meeting with the Call Committee. At that meeting he will bring the names and profiles of 4 candidates for Good Shepherd's next pastor. Pastor Andy and Bishop Shelley have reviewed and reflected on the materials the Transition Team submitted, prayed and discerned, and have selected candidates that they think will be a good fit for Good Shepherd.

It's important to know that all information about the candidates (including name, gender, and current location) will all be confidential through this part of the process—in fact, the Call Committee will be referring to the candidates even among themselves as "Candidate A", "Candidate B" etc. This is important for several reasons—in part because often a pastor's congregation doesn't know they are interviewing until they are further along in the process.

If you recall, a few weeks ago the congregation gave the council the ability to tap into the benevolence fund for the next three years if needed, so Good Shepherd can offer a full-time call with benefits for the pastor and their family. The idea is that in order to have the time and capacity to lead the congregation deeper into community and outreach ministry, having a full-time pastor would be important. And it also felt important to be able to guarantee that for at least three years, particularly if a candidate is coming from another area. There was a strong sense that Good Shepherd has a calling and mission in the community and that its time to put everything we have toward figuring that out.

The Call Committee will do a first round of interviews by Zoom as a way to level out the experience for all the candidates regardless of whether they are local or somewhere else in the country. Then they will narrow down who to offer a second interview, which will be in person. When the Call Committee has identified their "candidate of choice" they will then confirm with the candidate that they are ready to move into the final phase of the interview. That's when the congregation will get all the information about the candidate—and a chance to "meet and greet" prior to a congregational vote. If approved by the congregation, there may be some final negotiations on salary and such, and upon the candidates acceptance of the letter of call, it will be all official. Then an installation will be scheduled and everyone can breathe a deep sigh of relief!

It may be the case that there isn't a good fit in the first round of candidates, and in that happens, we can request another "slate" from the Synod and repeat the process. But it sounds like we've got some good potential matches in this first round, so pray that we find the right connection!

And please keep praying for your call committee: Rick Homme, Donna Garland, Lori Fox, Karla Kloes, Tim Danner, and Terry Danner. They are working hard on your behalf and it really is hard work! If you have any questions about the process (aside from fishing for details on the candidates!) please reach out to me or any of the Call Committee members.
